## AHIMA Summer Team Talks - Chicago

Mary Meysenburg, Nancy Kinyoun, Ranae Race and Jean Scharfencamp attended the AHIMA Summer Team Talks.

Vera Rulon, AHIMA President opened with an announcement that Linda Kloss, CEO, had resigned effective March 2010. Linda was thanked for 15 years of AHIMA leadership and she received a standing ovation. Vera announced the AHIMA election results and noted that AHIMA had a record voting turnout.



The first day was focused on designing the future organization in light of ARRA, Health Reform, data content and data standards. The key success factors include: Agility, Leadership Development, Collaboration of Stakeholders, Generate evidence-based research, Reputation as a Trusted Knowledge Resource, High Quality Education, Effective Accreditation and Certification, Service Support for Members, a Clear Vision and Influence/shape policy. Discussion was held surrounding these key success factors for AHIMA 2015.

The House of Delegate workgroups gave an update of their respective teams. A resolution for Professional Guidelines/Best Practices for Electronic Documentation was submitted by Tennessee Health Information Management Association. The next generation of the AHIMA COP was discussed. The COP is being overhauled and will emerge as a very robust tool with search capabilities across the entire AHIMA website. The AHIMA liaison for NHIMA is second-year Director, Mary Reeves. She is Director of Medical Information Services at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN.
